

RESOLUTION NO. 160/2024 OF THE SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WROCŁAW

of 18 December 2024

on the principles of recruitment to the Doctoral School of the University of Wrocław for the training programme starting in the academic year 2025/2026

Pursuant to Article 200, section 2 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal of Laws 2024, item 1571, as amended), it is resolved as follows:

- § 1.1. The Senate of the University of Wrocław lays down the rules and procedures for recruitment to the Doctoral School of the University of Wrocław, hereinafter referred to as the Doctoral School.
 - 2. Recruitment is conducted through a competition.
- 3. Recruitment is conducted within the Doctoral Colleges of the Doctoral School (hereinafter referred to as Colleges), as defined by the relevant ordinance of the Rector of the University of Wrocław, which educates students in specific scientific disciplines.
- 4. Detailed conditions and mode of recruitment to the Doctoral School in the academic year 2025/2026, for particular disciplines in colleges, are defined in appendixes no. 1-20 to this resolution.
- 5. The deadlines for the registration of candidates and the detailed schedule of qualification proceedings for particular colleges, including the deadlines for the submission of documents and the admission limits, are specified in the appropriate ordinances of the Rector of the University of Wrocław.
- 6. Apart from the admission limits referred to in section 5, candidates for whom funding for a doctoral scholarship is provided from sources other than the subsidy (e.g. research projects, programmes, etc.) may be admitted. This funding should also cover the costs of social security contributions payable by the University.
- 7. For the candidates referred to in section 6, separate recruitment outside the schedule referred to in section 5 may be announced, with the consent of the Rector, considering additional requirements related to the implementation of the project, programme, etc. The recruitment conditions specified in the appendixes to this resolution shall also apply accordingly to these candidates.
- 8. Admission of a person referred to in section 6 is conditional on the submission of the documents required for admission to the Doctoral School, including documents evidencing the funding awarded to cover the costs of education, and obtaining at least the minimum score in the recruitment process, as well as meeting the requirements on which the funding is conditional.
- § 2.1. The admission procedure is conducted by admission committees appointed for each college by the appropriate dean from among the members of the appropriate Academic Discipline Council.
- 2. When appointing the admission committee, the chairperson, vice-chairperson (if applicable) and examiners shall be identified. The chairperson and vice-chairperson of the admission committee may also act as examiners. A secretary, who will not be a member of the committee, may be appointed to provide administrative support to the committee.
- 3. The admission committee shall be composed of academic staff representing the academic disciplines in which the college provides education, at least two from each discipline, including the head of the college if he/she is a member of the Academic Discipline Council. At the request of the chairperson of the admission committee, the dean may additionally appoint as a member of the admission committee a manager of a research project, programme, etc., in the implementation of which the person referred to in § 1, section 6 will be involved (provided that the person meets the condition set forth in section 1).
- 4. The chairperson of the admission committee has the right to invite, in an advisory capacity, specialists to support the work of the committee. At the request of the competent body of the Doctoral Student Self-Government, a representative of doctoral students may participate in the work of the committee as an observer.

- 5. In the event of circumstances preventing a member of the admission committee from taking part in its work directly, the dean shall appoint a new member in his/her place.
- 6. The composition of the admission committee shall be made public by the appropriate dean prior to the commencement of the admission procedure.
- § 3.1. A member of the admission committee is obliged to inform the chairperson of any circumstances that might affect his/her impartiality and objectivity in assessing a candidate for the Doctoral School.
- 2. The chairperson of the admission committee may decide to exclude a committee member from the assessment procedure of a given candidate if his/her participation could raise justified doubts about his/her objectivity and impartiality, in particular, if the committee member:
- 1) plans to take on the duties of a supervisor or assistant supervisor of the candidate;
- 2) was the supervisor of the candidate's master's or bachelor's thesis;
- 3) is the candidate's superior or is in another employment relationship with the candidate;
- 4) the candidate is or was his/her spouse or is a relative or relative by affinity up to the second degree or runs a led joint household.
 - 3. A member of the admission committee may also be excluded upon a reasoned request.
- 4. The exclusion of a member of the admission committee from the assessment of a given candidate shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting of the committee.
- § 4.1. The aim of the admission procedure is to select the best candidates for education at the Doctoral School of the University of Wrocław.
- 2. The assessment of a candidate for admission to the Doctoral School is conducted by the members of the admission committee: all of them or those indicated by the chairperson of the admission committee.
- 3. In colleges providing education in more than one discipline, the assessment of a given candidate in the admission procedure is primarily conducted by the committee members representing the appropriate discipline. Section 2 is applied accordingly.
- 4. The admission committee assesses the candidate's aptitude, skills and achievements for study at the Doctoral School. This assessment is based in particular on: previous documented scientific achievements to date, a preliminary research project, and the result of qualifying examinations.
 - **§ 5.** The tasks of the admission committee include, in particular:
- 1) notifying candidates of the date and place of the qualification proceedings;
- 2) conducting the qualification procedure;
- 3) receiving and verifying the completeness of candidates' documents;
- 4) admitting candidates to the Doctoral School within a given college, subject to the stipulation referred to in § 13, section 3, taking into account the determined admission limit;
- 5) taking administrative decisions on refusal of admission to the college in question, subject to § 14, section 1;
- 6) examining applications for reconsideration of a case and giving opinions on complaints lodged by candidates in relation to the admission procedure;
- 7) preparing documentation of the admission procedure:
 - a) descriptive minutes of the admission committee signed by the chairperson and all members of the admission committee;
 - b) individual minutes;
 - c) a ranking list of candidates taken part in the admission process to a given college (based on the results of the admission procedure);
 - d) the list of persons admitted to the Doctoral School at a given college (in the case of Polish citizens);
 - e) the list of persons qualified for admission to the Doctoral School at a given college (in the case of foreigners);
 - f) the list of persons not admitted/not qualified for admission to the Doctoral School, together with the reasons for refusal of admission to the Doctoral School;
- 8) announcing the ranking list of the admission procedure and the list of persons included in the list of doctoral students of the Doctoral School at a given college.
- § 6.1. To the qualification procedure in the chosen discipline, may be admitted a candidate who:

- 1) registering in the Internet Registration of Candidates (IRK);
- holds a master's degree, master of engineering degree or an equivalent degree awarded on the basis of separate regulations or, in a case justified by the highest quality of scientific achievements, is a graduate of first-cycle studies or a student who has completed the third year of long-cycle studies;
- 3) paid a recruitment fee of PLN 150 for each discipline chosen;
- 4) submitted the required set of documents.
- 2. The registration procedures in the IRK or IRC system and the organisation of the recruitment process to the Doctoral School at the University of Wrocław are defined by the relevant ordinance of the Rector of the University of Wrocław.
- § 7.1. A candidate for the Doctoral School is obliged to provide a photocopy of the diploma with the original to be inspected in order to confirm its conformity by the University of Wrocław or a notarised copy of this document or a certificate of completion of studies together with other required documents at a given college of the Doctoral School, within the deadline specified in the recruitment schedule.
- 2. In the case of failure to submit the complete set of required documents within the specified time, the admission committee will refuse to admit the candidate to the Doctoral School.
- 3. Diplomas obtained abroad require authentication in the form of either legalisation or apostille.
- 4. A candidate applying for admission to the Doctoral School is obliged to submit a translation into Polish (or, additionally, into English) of those documents for which such a requirement is indicated in the detailed recruitment rules set out in appendixes no. 1-20 to this resolution. The translation must be certified by a Polish sworn translator (entered in the list of sworn translators kept by the Minister of Justice), a sworn translator from the EU (if there is a sworn translator's institution in that country) or a Polish consul.
- 5. A detailed list of the required documents at each college of the Doctoral School is set out in appendixes 1-20 to this resolution.
- § 8.1. All personal data provided by candidates are processed and stored for the purpose of registration in accordance with applicable legislation and are subject to protection.
- 2. If a candidate is enrolled as a doctoral student, the data used in the recruitment process will be transferred to the University of Wrocław's IT systems, including in particular the USOS system, and will be processed in accordance with other applicable regulations for the purpose of organising and ensuring the proper course of education at the Doctoral School.
- § 9. Candidates with identified disabilities shall, upon their request, be provided with assistance and accommodations in the recruitment process according to their individual needs.
- § 10. People who are not Polish citizens may undertake and pursue education at the Doctoral School according to the rules set out in Section VIII of the Act of 20 July 2018 Law on Higher Education and Science (consolidated text: Journal of Laws, item 478, as amended) and the detailed rules of admission set out in the appendixes to this resolution.
- § 11.1. In justified cases, the recruitment procedure can be conducted remotely with the use of commonly available means of electronic communication, ensuring control of the proceedings and their registration and allowing for the secrecy of votes.
- 2. If a remote interview is scheduled via instant messenger, the candidate's written consent to the electronic recording of the interview must be sent to the address of the recruitment committee's secretary or chairperson before the interview.
- 3.If a candidate is unable to submit the original documents directly before the exam or interview, the electronic version of the required documents attached in the IRK or IRC system will be considered. The candidate is obliged to ask in advance the chairperson or secretary of the admission committee for permission to attach the documents in electronic version, stating the reason for not being able to directly submit the documents in a paper version.
- 4.In the case of a situation referred to in section 3, a possible positive decision on admission to the Doctoral School of a candidate who is not a Polish citizen will be conditional, specifying the deadlines for the submission of the original required documents or their notarised photocopies. Entry to the list of the remaining candidates will take place after submission of

documents in the form specified in § 7 section 1, within the deadline specified in the recruitment schedule.

- § 12.1. The results of the recruitment procedure are public and subject to publication.
- 2. The ranking list drawn up by the committee shall include:
- 1) names and surnames of the candidates;
- 2) the final result of the candidates' evaluation;
- 3) an indication of whether the candidate has been shortlisted for entry into the Doctoral School (in the case of Polish citizens) or if he/she is qualified to accept (in the case od foreigners)
- 3. The chairperson of the admission committee signs the ranking list. Any deletions or changes made to the ranking list after it has been signed should include a justification and be confirmed by the signature of the chairperson of the admission committee.
- 4. The candidate receives information about the result of the recruitment process to his/her personal registration account in the IRK or IRC system.
- 5. The ranking list referred to in section 2, together with a descriptive report, the list of those accepted and those not accepted at a given college (in case of Polish citizens) or list of those qualified or not qualified (in case of foreigners) is communicated by the admission committee to the appropriate Vice-Rector. The admission committee publish this list in a publicly accessible place appropriate for a given college and on the unit's website. The ranking list should include the date of the announcement.
- § 13.1. The admission committee shall announce the list of people admitted to a given college immediately after the limit of admission by candidates entered on the list of doctoral students of a given college, but not later than on 19 September 2025.
- 2. In the event of a vacancy in the list of doctoral students admitted to a particular college, a person from the ranked list shall be included in the list of doctoral students of that college, taking into account the order resulting from the admission procedure, but no later than the end of the first month of the academic year.
- 3. In the case of candidates who are not Polish citizens, entry into the list of doctoral students at a given college takes place on the basis of an administrative decision admitting a candidate to the Doctoral School, issued by the Rector or a person authorised by the Rector.
- 4. The final list of people accepted to the Doctoral School is published on the University of Wrocław website.
- 5. In the event of the limit of places remaining unfilled, additional recruitment for a given programme of study at the Doctoral School may take place at the written request of the chairperson of the admission committee, with the opinion of the dean, addressed to the appropriate Vice-Rector, and in accordance with the recruitment schedule set by the admission committee.
- § 14.1. Admission to the Doctoral School is refused by an administrative decision signed by all members of the committee and, in the case of candidates without Polish citizenship, by the Rector or a person authorised by the Rector, delivered to the candidate in accordance with the general rules.
- 2. The candidate has the right to submit a request for reconsideration within 14 days of the delivery of the decision to refuse admission to the Doctoral School. The candidate may also, within 30 days from the date of delivery of the decision, file a complaint with the Provincial Administrative Court in Wroclaw through the admission committee (in the case of candidates without Polish citizenship, through the Rector), without having to submit a request for reconsideration.
- 3. The basis for the application may only be the indication of the violation of the rules and procedures of admission to the Doctoral School within a given college. The application should indicate precisely the provisions defining the conditions or procedure for recruitment, which, in the opinion of the candidate, have been violated, and include a concise explanation of the alleged violation
- 4. The application referred to in section 3 shall be considered by the admission committee, and in the case of persons of non-Polish nationality by the Rector, after obtaining the opinion of the admission committee.
- 5. The granting in full of the application referred to in section 2 results in an administrative decision to overturn the decision to refuse admission of the candidate to the Doctoral School and subsequently in the candidate's entry into the list of doctoral students of the respective college of the Doctoral School. In the situation of filling the limit of admissions, the chairperson of the

admission committee shall apply to the Vice-Rector for permission to exceed the limit set for a given college.

- 6. The decision of the admissions committee, and in the case of non-citizens, the decision of the Rector is final. It may be appealed against to the Provincial Administrative Court.
 - § 15. The resolution comes into force on the day of its adoption.

 - c. **1 points** other scientific publications. Total **0-10 points.**
- Participation in research projects. Include confirmation of participation from the project manager or award decision.
 - a. **3 points** the role of contractor or manager in projects of NCN, NCBiR, MNISW, H2020, ERC, European Commission and other foreign institutions and organisations;
 - b. **1 point** contractor's or manager's role in other projects.

Total **0-5 points.**

 Activity in scientific circles, participation in conference organising committees or activities popularising science.

A certificate from the organisers of the event and, in the case of scientific circles, a certificate issued by the supervisor of the scientific circle should be enclosed. The Commission awards a number of points based on a qualitative assessment of the achievements. Total **0-5 points.**

- Active participation in scientific conference (with paper, poster, etc.) Include the conference programme and a certificate/confirmation from the organisers.
 - a. 1 point student-doctoral conference,
 - b. 2 points Polish national/wide conference,
 - c. **3 points** international conference (min. 30% of participants with papers from outside the organiser's country).

Total **0-5 points.**

6. Academic scholarships and prizes awarded within and outside the University, participation in student exchange programmes (Erasmus+, Most, other) Certificate, acknowledgement or diploma must be attached. The Commission awards a number of points based on a qualitative assessment of the achievements.

Total **0-5 points.**

7. **Preliminary examination** - discussion of the submitted dissertation project.

Total **0-20 points.**
